

The Department of International Law and European Law

The Department of International Law and European Law is a scientific and pedagogical establishment whose main goal is to profile students of all forms and degrees of study in the multispectral area of international and European law. By its offer of compulsory and elective courses, the department covers a wide range of topics related not only to the fundamental structure of the curriculum of public international law, private international law and European law, but also to problems arising from current developments in international and European law.

At present, the Department of International Law and European Law provides undergraduate courses International Public Law I, International Public Law II, European Law I and European Law II, while offering the opportunity to attend seminars in both Slovak and English language. At the same time, the department provides elective courses International Relations, Law of International Treaties, International Protection of the Rights of Persons Belonging to Minorities, International Protection of Human Rights, Fundamentals of Common Law and The Law of Internal Market in the EU.

As part of the master's program, the Department of International Law and European Law provides the compulsory course Private International Law, while again offering the opportunity to attend seminars in Slovak or English language. The department also offers courses European Competition Law, International Trade Law, International Humanitarian Law.

Furthermore, the department offers courses in English language European Migration Law and EU Gender Equality Law, as well as courses concerning State Aid Law and Fundamentals of Public Procurement Law, which are open to students of both bachelor's and master's degree programs.

The department is also involved in clinical legal education, by offering Asylum Law Clinic I and II, Anti-Discrimination Law Clinic, Clinic of Treaty Negotiations, EU Competition Law Clinic, Public Procurement Law Clinic, International Law Clinic and Consular Law Clinic.

The research activities of the department focus mainly on international treaty law, international environmental law, human rights in the European and international dimension, EU competition law, EU migration law as well as private international labour law and materialization of private international law.
